

# U.S. Bishops Urge Prayer as High Court Poised to Hear Cases on Pill Used in Abortion

(OSV News) — As the Supreme Court prepares to take up two cases on access to pills commonly used for early abortions, U.S. Catholic bishops have issued a nationwide call to prayer to end abortion and protect

women and unborn children.

The invitation was issued March 14 by Archbishop Timothy P. Broglio of the U.S. Archdiocese for Military Services, president of the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops, and Bishop Michael F. Burbidge

of Arlington, Virginia, chairman of the USCCB's Committee on Pro-Life Activities.

The prayer campaign, which seeks the intercession of St. Joseph as the "Defender of Life," begins March 25, the day before the Supreme Court hears

oral arguments for Food and Drug Administration v. Alliance for Hippocratic Medicine and Danco Laboratories v. Alliance for Hippocratic Medicine. Both cases center on the drug mifepristone and its widespread availability.

The start date also marks

the anniversary of the release of Pope St. John Paul II's 1995 encyclical "Evangelium Vitae" ("The Gospel of Life"). The encyclical itself was published on that year's observance of the feast of the Annunciation of the Lord, which in 2024

#### Sexual Abuse Awareness Training

The U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops requires all Dioceses/Eparchies have a Safe Environment Program for the protection of children and young people. In accordance with these requirements, the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston's Safe Environment Program consists of the following components for persons seeking employment or to volunteer, directly or indirectly, with children: background check; receipt of the Diocese's Policy Relating to Sexual Abuse of Children; and sexual abuse awareness training for adults. Sexual abuse awareness training may be completed online or via live workshop. For more information, go to www.dwc.org, click "Diocese", then "Offices," then "Office of Safe Environment."

To Report Suspected Cases of Sexual Abuse of Children: The Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston encourages reporting to civil authorities first and foremost if a crime has been committed. We also encourage utilizing www.reportbishopabuse.org to make a report about any bishop in the U.S. If you have reason to believe that a bishop has engaged in sexual misconduct or has interfered with an investigation into sexual misconduct, please contact civil authorities in the applicable jurisdiction and visit www.reportbishop abuse.org. To Report to Civil Authorities: Contact your local law enforcement: numbers will vary based on your location. If you believe someone is in immediate danger, call 911. To confidentially report any incidence of suspected child abuse or neglect, including sexual abuse, contact the West Virginia Bureau for Children and Families' Child Protective Services by calling the Child Abuse Hotline at 800.352.6513. You may report anonymously to this hotline if you prefer. To Report to Diocesan Authorities: The diocese encourages reporting to the appropriate civil authorities first and foremost if a crime has been committed. for the safety of both Mother and Child.


We praise God that as their faithful protector, you never hesitated to sacrifice for those entrusted to you.

will be celebrated Monday, April 8. The daily prayer for the campaign is shown above and available in English and Spanish at respect-life.org/prayer-to-st-joseph.

"We ask Catholics to offer this prayer daily, from March 25 through June, when a decision is expected," wrote Archbishop Broglio and Bishop Burbidge.

First approved by the FDA in 2000, mifepristone blocks the hormone progesterone, which maintains proper conditions in the uterus during pregnancy. The drug is paired with misoprostol (initially created to treat gastric ulcers) as

part of a chemical regimen used in more than half of all U.S. abortions in 2020.

More recently, the same pill combination has also been prescribed to women who experience early pregnancy miscarriage in order to expel any fetal remains and residual pregnancy tissue from the womb. The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists updated its protocols to recommend a combination of mifepristone and misoprostol as more effective than misoprostol alone for early miscarriage care based on research published since 2018.

Last year, the doctors and medical professionals represented by the Alliance for Hippocratic Medi-

cine challenged the FDA's greenlighting of mifepristone as unsafe.

While it struck down the alliance's request in August 2023, the 5th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals did revoke the FDA's efforts to increase access to the drug. Nonetheless, an earlier stay issued by the nation's top court has maintained broad access to the drug.

The bishops acknowledged that the upcoming Supreme Court case "is not about ending chemical abortion," but still has the potential to "restore limitations that the FDA has overridden."

"When a Supreme Court decision is released, probably in June, we can expect a public and political reaction similar to the Dobbs deci-

sion that overturned Roe v. Wade," they wrote.

On March 11, Bishop Burbidge issued a statement expressing "great sorrow" after the body of a preterm baby was discovered in a pond in Leesburg, Virginia.

The bishop asked the faithful to pray "for the child's mother and for anyone involved in this incident" and offered burial services while highlighting diocesan resources for women in challenging pregnancies.

Bishop Mark Brennan wants a large delegation there with him from the diocese. Sending a member(s) from your parish/mission is an investment for the parish. Each person sent to the national congress will return to with revival energy, items to display and share, and ideas for all the faithful to grow in the local church.

We had a deadline of March 15 to get our last spots for our travel package filled, but were able to extend that to April 17 (paid in full date).

Comparison price per person based on double room occupancy – ours is \$1,119: Archdiocese of Milwaukee double occupancy costs \$1,150, Diocese of Grand Rapids Michigan \$1,299; and Diocese of Saginaw \$1,299.

Note: all three of these examples are not even traveling as far as our diocese!

Your diocesan team vetted the best package on your behalf.

To echo the importance for the faithful of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston to attend and support those in your parish/ mission attending, Bishop Mark Brennan said, "Your support makes a difference. # Holy Thursday Pilgrimage to be Held Again in Wheeling

atholic faithful are invited once again to join in a Holy Thursday Pilgrimage (March 28) visiting six churches in Wheeling "to pray and 'keep watch' before the Blessed Sacrament at the Altar of Repose" in each church

The pilgrimage will begin in the evening at the Cathedral of St. Joseph and then make visits to St. Alphonsus, Our Lady of Peace, St. Vincent de Paul, St. Michael's, and Corpus Christi churches in Wheeling. Father Sateesh Narisetti, HGN, J.C.L., vice rector of the cathedral, extended the invitation to all at the end of a recent livestreamed, Sunday Mass from the cathedral.

"In keeping with an ancient tradition in the church we are excited to be hosting a special pilgrimage on Holy Thursday night to visit multiple churches in the Wheeling area," Father Narisetti said.

This is the second year the pilgrimage will be held, providing Catholics with the opportunity to spend quiet time with our Lord and begin the Triduum together.

"During the pilgrimage, the faithful will have the opportunity to visit six churches in the Wheeling area to pray before the Blessed Sacrament," organizers said. "A special booklet has been created which allows the pilgrims to follow along the narrative of Jesus' time in the Garden of Gethsemane as well as provide opportunities for personal prayer and meditation."

Bus transportation will be provided, but faithful can also make the pilgrimage using their own transportation.


The pilgrimage includes two separate schedules for the evening with two separate buses. Those using their own transportation to visit the churches can follow behind one of the buses in their own vehicle or go on their own, organizers said. Bus #1 will depart from the cathedral at 8 p.m. and return at approximately 10:45 p.m. Bus #2 will depart from the cathedral at 9 p.m. and return at approximately 11:45 p.m.



### We Can Learn a Lot from St. Joseph, Bishop Brennan Says on Feast of Diocese's Patron

e can learn a lot from St. Joseph, Bishop Mark Brennan said. He was not only a just man, but a righteous one. The bishop shared these thoughts in his homily at the noon Mass at the Cathedral of St. Joseph in Wheeling for the Feast of St. Joseph, patron saint of the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston. This was one of three Masses the bishop celebrated that day; the first was that morning at the cathedral for the students of Central Catholic High School in Wheeling.

The noon Mass was celebrated for the cathedral parishioners, chancery employees, and area faithful. In reflecting on St. Joseph, who is also patron saint of the universal church as well as the cathedral, Bishop Brennan said, "We think of Joseph's great virtues, his obedience to God's will even when it was not clear."

Like St. Joseph, the bishop said, we must obey God's will even when it's not easy or understandable.


"We need to pray for the strength to obey the Lord regardless, and he will give us the strength to do the right thing," the bishop said.

He spoke of St. Joseph's protection of Mary and Jesus, his work as a craftsman, and support of the Holy Family. We can learn from St. Joseph's commitment to work hard, the bishop said. He worked hard at his craft for Mary and Jesus, and for people in Nazareth as well

"So, we should work hard also to serve those who need us, whether that's for our family or for our neighbor," the bishop said.

"Through his word and through the sacraments, God gives us the strength to live as Joseph lived," the bishop said. He is a hero to all of us, the bishop added, and can help us, in turn, by how we live "to be heroes to the young who can imitate us as we strive to imitate St. Joseph."

At the end of the Mass, Bishop Brennan thanked the priests who concelebrated—Msgr. Joseph L. Peterson, V.G.; Father Sateesh Narisetti, HGN, J.C.L., vice rector of the cathedral; and Father Praveen Kumar Mallela, HGN, parochial vicar at St. Michael Parish in Wheeling. The bishop also thanked Deacon Paul Lim, vice president for Mission Integration at WVU Medicine Wheeling Hospital, for serving as deacon; and Central Catholic



### Wheeling University Professor Younkins Presenter at Economics Research Conference

**WHEELING** — Dr. Edward Younkins, professor of Accountancy and Business at Wheeling University, gave the opening lecture at the Mises Institute's Austrian Economics Research Conference on March 21 in Auburn, Alabama.

Dr. Younkins, Wheeling class of 1970, presented the Henry Hazlitt Memorial Lecture at the conference titled, "Ayn Rand and the Austrian Economists." The Austrian Economics Research Conference is the international, interdisciplinary meeting of the Austrian school, bringing together leading scholars doing research in this vibrant and influential intellectual tradition.

"I am excited to give this talk on Carl Menger, Ludwig von Mises, and Murray Rothbard, and how their ideas may be complementary to the essential ideas of Ayn Rand's philosophy of Objectivism," Younkins said before the event. "This is quite an honor to deliver this lecture, which I hope those attending the conference, will find insightful and educational."

He discussed some of Menger's key ideas while comparing them with those of Ayn Rand. He then repeated this process with the fundamental ideas of Mises and Rothbard. His conclusion offered an overall assessment with respect to the potential compatibility Austrian economics and Ayn Rand's philosophy of Objectivism.

Younkins, who has taught at Wheeling for more than 50 years, is also the executive director of In-

stitute for the Study of Capitalism and Morality, and the founder of the university's undergraduate major in Political and Economic Philosophy. Additionally, is the founding director of the school's Master of Business (MBA) and Master of Science in Accountancy (MSA) programs. He earned a Ph.D. in Accountancy from the University of Mississippi. Dr. Younkins also received the Outstanding Educator Award in 1997 from the West Virginia Society of CPAs. The author of numerous articles in accounting and business journals, Younkins has authored or edited a dozen books including his trilogy of books on freedom and flourishing: Capitalism and Commerce, Champions of a Free Society, and Flourishing







# Obispos de EE.UU. instan a orar mientras la Corte Suprema se prepara para escuchar casos sobre píldoras abortivas

(OSV News) — Mientras la Corte Suprema se prepara para abordar dos casos sobre el acceso a píldoras comúnmente utilizadas para abortos tempranos, los obispos católicos de EE.UU. han emitido un llamado a la oración a nivel nacional para poner fin al aborto y proteger a mujeres y los niños no nacidos.

La invitación fue emitida el 14 de marzo por el arzobispo Timothy P. Broglio de la Arquidiócesis de los Servicios Militares de los Estados Unidos, presidente de la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos, y el obispo Michael F. Burbidge de Arlington, Virginia, presidente del Comité de Actividades Pro-Vida de la USCCB.

La campaña de oración, que busca la intercesión de San José como "Defensor de la vida", comienza el 25 de marzo, en la víspera del día que la Corte Suprema escuche los argumentos orales para los casos de Food and Drug Administration v. Alliance for Hippocratic Medicine y Danco Laboratories v. Alliance for Hippocratic Medicine. Ambos casos se centran en la droga mifepristona y su amplia disponibilidad.

La fecha de inicio también marca el aniversario de la publicación de la encíclica "Evangelium Vitae" ("El Evangelio de la vida") del Papa San Juan Pablo II de 1995. La encíclica en sí se publicó en la celebración de ese año de la fiesta de la Anunciación del Señor, que en el año 2024 se celebrará el lunes 8 de

abril.

La oración diaria por la campaña está disponible en español e inglés en respectlife.org/prayer-tost-joseph.

"Pedimos a los católicos que recen esta oración diariamente, desde el 25 de marzo hasta junio, cuando se espera una decisión", escribieron el arzobispo Broglio y el obispo Burbidge.

Aprobada por primera vez por la FDA en 2000, la mifepristona bloquea la hormona progesterona, que mantiene las condiciones adecuadas en el útero durante el embarazo. El medicamento se combina con misoprostol (inicialmente creado para tratar las úlceras gástricas) como parte de un régimen químico utilizado en más de la mitad de todos los abortos en EE.UU. en 2020.

Más recientemente, también se ha recetado la misma combinación de pastillas a mujeres que sufren un aborto espontáneo en las primeras etapas del embarazo para expulsar del útero cualquier resto fetal y tejido residual del embarazo. El Colegio Estadounidense de Obstetras y Ginecólogos actualizó sus protocolos para recomendar una combinación de mifepristona y misoprostol como más eficaz que el misoprostol solo para la atención temprana del aborto espontáneo, según una investigación publicada desde 2018.

El año pasado, los médicos y profesionales médicos representados por la Alianza para la Medicina Hipocrática cuestionaron la aprobación por parte de la FDA de la mifepristona como insegura.

Si bien anuló la solicitud de la alianza en agosto de 2023, la Corte de Apelaciones del Quinto Circuito de EE.UU. revocó los esfuerzos de la FDA para aumentar el acceso al medicamento. No obstante, una suspensión anterior emitida por el tribunal superior del país ha mantenido un amplio acceso a la droga.

Los obispos reconocieron que el próximo caso de la Corte Suprema "no trata de poner fin al aborto químico", pero aún tiene el potencial de "restaurar las limitaciones que la FDA ha anulado".

"Cuando se publique una decisión de la Corte Suprema, probablemente en junio, podemos esperar una reacción pública y política similar a la decisión Dobbs que anuló Roe v. Wade", escribieron

El 11 de marzo, el obispo Burbidge emitió una declaración expresando "gran dolor" después de que se descubriera el cuerpo de un bebé prematuro en un estanque en Leesburg, Virginia.

El obispo pidió a los fieles que oraran "por la madre del niño y por cualquiera involucrado en este incidente", y ofreció servicios de entierro al tiempo que destacó los recursos diocesanos para mujeres en embarazos difíciles.


